Rodney A. Brown, founder/director of The Brown Dance Project (The BDP) is an Associate Professor/ Researcher at The Ohio State University (USA). His field is Modern (or Contemporary) Dance Technique, Repertory and Dance Composition. His research is on uses of dance as a tool for entertainment, Social Justice, HIV/AIDS education and education in various contexts. The imperative of his current project seeks to translate words to dance material such that a viewer can distinguish some functional differences between Red and White Blood Cells, dissimilarities of HIV and AIDS, understanding of Stigma, 4 fact-based ways HIV can be transmitted and ways to prevent HIV infection — mediated with Contemporary Dance. Brown's special interests involve HIV/AIDS prevention, dance as an ethnographic tool (storytelling), African Americans, and words to movement translation.
