NORTH EAST INDIA STUDIES PROGRAMME (NEISP)

75. Chair Professor for Tribal Studies (Unreserved) (Tenure Post for Two Years)

The core focus of this chair is to encourage comparative research across tribes, particularly those residing in India. Drawing upon the global practices, and also drawing from experiences of other marginalized social groups in India, the Chair will support and lead research that can help address social, economic and cultural challenges that tribes face in India as a result of unfolding historical and social changes, and development practices in post independent India. It is expected that the experience of dealing with these forces of change, particularly globalisation, state's development policies, new nation narratives, etc. will be incorporated in the knowledge frameworks that the Chair will help construct. The Chair will also provide leadership in exploring answers that are based on intensive study of worldviews, and socio-cultural practices of tribes in India. The research focus of the Chair is based on the belief that it is possible to construct sustainable pathways of development that meet the needs of environmental integrity, social and gender justice, cultural rights, economic freedom and political autonomy.

Based on the aforementioned understanding, JNU is looking for a senior researcher, who can provide academic leadership in research and teaching of Tribal Studies in the University and who has an intellectual agenda during the period of this appointment that overlaps with the larger objectives of this chair. Specifically, areas of specialization for the Chair Professor for Tribal Studies are: Comparative Tribal Studies with focus on comparisons at the intra region and inter regional level, both nationally and globally; And Tribes and

Modernity with focus on modern institutions and the social, cultural, economic and political experiences of tribal social groups.

DEFINITION OF THE PH CATEGORIES

The categorization of the physically handicapped persons for purposes of reservations in employment will be on the basis of the following definition: -

- (i) **Blindness or Low Vision** The blind are those who suffer from either of the following conditions:
 - (a) Total absence of sight;
 - (b) Visual acuity not exceeding 6/60 or 20/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with correcting lenses;
 - (c) Limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of 20 degrees or worse.
- (ii) **Hearing Impairment** The deaf are those in whom the sense of hearing is non-functional for ordinary purposes of life. They do not hear, understand sounds at all even with amplified speech. The cases included in this category will be those having hearing loss more than 60 decibels in the better ear (pro-found impairment) or total loss of hearing in both ears.
- (iii) Locomotor Disability or Cerebral palsy The orthopedically handicapped are those who have a minimum of 40 % of physical defect or deformity which causes an interference with the normal functioning of the bones, muscles and joints.
