Q. (a) Whether the Government has any plans to introduce the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in the Central University apart from Delhi University;

Reply (a): Jawaharlal Nehru University is already following the Choice Based Credit System.

Q. (b) If so, the details thereof; and

Reply (b): **Semesterization of curricula:** The semester-wise (i.e. Monsoon semester & Winter semester) curricula are prescribed for each programme of studies in the University since inception.

Restructuring of syllabi in the form of modules: The syllabi for the courses are also prescribed semester-wise and the courses are being updated regularly from time to time and uploaded in the JNU web-site.

Standardization of examination: The examinations are conducted department-wise and three mid-semester/sessional exams and end semester exams are prescribed for each of course study semester-wise. A copy of academic calendar (for the next academic session 2016-17) is also enclosed for your kind information and reference.

Switching-over from numerical marking system to grading system: The University follows a ten-point letter grading scale for evaluation of students' academic performance in the courses during the semester as under:
