He has 20 years of experience in doing research, fieldwork, and giving classes and lectures at different universities in Argentina, Brazil, and India (UNQ, UNGS, UNDEC, UNSAM, UNTREF, UNCAUS, UTDT, FLACSO, UNDEF, ISEN, UFRJ, FIOCRUZ, JNU, etc.) mainly on India, comparative development, innovation and entrepreneurial systems, and industrial and STI policy.
