# Leadership for Academicians Programme

#### Introduction of the Programme

In pursuance of National Initiative for leadership development programme (LEAP), the HRDC, JNU is conducting three weeks training prgamme ( one week in a collaboration with the National University of Singapore) in the month of February and March 2019. The broad vision of this training programme is to create excellence in leadership in Higher Educational Institutions in India through a pool of trained professional. Even the new universities and institutions are becoming the clones of the older universities following the conventional educational policies and framework whereas today's new realities require new goals, modes and methods of organization and management of educational institutions.

With highly advanced technologies and changing times, the context within which educational systems have to respond need to be revisited. The goals, objectives, financing, human resource management, administrative law and quality assurance within a new establishment have to be prioritised and strictly adhere to for a quality outcome. This programme is intended to build a pool of higher managerial capability and enrich the knowledge of existing leaders and also to draw fresh, talented individuals who can take over leadership roles in future at various levels in academic administration.

#### **Objectives of the Programme**

The main goal of the leadership development programme (LEAP) is to equip higher educational leaders and educational administrators to handle competently and efficiently the complex problems and leadership challenges which arise in the academic, financial and administrative aspects of the functioning of their respective institutions. The three-week programme will provide in-depth familiarization with required leadership and management skills, preparation of a vision a strategy plan, understanding complexity of governance in higher educational institutions, financial and general administration, handling conflicts, promoting research etc.

The specific objectives of the leadership development programme are:

- 1. To provide visionary leadership and strategic thrust to higher educational institutions leading to academic excellence
- 2. To lead and enable the academic as well as administrative teams, diverse workforce, through positive work culture and team work throughout the institution.
- 3. To facilitate higher education leaders to competently deal with the leadership challenges which arise in academic institutions.
- 4. To explore technologies for deeper engagement to bring in performance culture and efficiency.
- 5. To facilitate innovation and creativity in teaching as well as learning, and overall effectiveness of the Institutions.

#### Duration of the Programme

Three weeks: Two weeks (11<sup>th</sup> February to 22<sup>nd</sup> Febraury, 2019) at India Habitate Centre, New Delhi. One Week Programme (4<sup>th</sup> March to 8<sup>th</sup> March, 2019) at National University of Singapore. The Departure for Singapore will be on 2<sup>nd</sup> March, 2019 and the participants will return to India on 9<sup>th</sup>/10<sup>th</sup> March, 2019.

### **Training Module**

The training will be imparted in a small group of 30 individuals from higher educational institutions in India. Training methods will include classroom teaching, role play, case studies, action/ group based activities, field visits to best run organizations both within and outside educational sector etc. The programme will create opportunities to share the real life experience and to synthesize lessons among a group of peers. The instructors will focus on interactivity and dynamic discussion rather than passive instructional techniques.



# Training outcome

This training programme is expected to achieve the following:

- Improved governance, managerial and leadership capacities of Higher Education leaders.
- Improved interpersonal relationship management skills of leaders leading to improved morale of staff and higher academic performance.
- Creation of an expanded pool of capable and high thinking leaders and administrators who could be the future leaders of the academic institutions in the country.

The participants will be able to expand their global academic network in Singapore and beyond allowing them continuous exchange of information and learning ever after the programme, particularly with professionals in the Higher Education.

- 1. At least 8 years of experience in the grade of a full professor as on 10<sup>th</sup> January 2019.
- 2. At least 3 years of experience in any administrative position.
- 3. Not above the age of 55 years on 30<sup>th</sup> September 2018.
- 4. High academic standing preferbly 30 publications in SCOPUS indexed journals / UGC recognized journals.
- 5. Impeccable integrity.

All the expenditure related to travel of participants within India and to Singapore and the local hospitality and other expenditure at both places will be borne by the organizers.
