JNU has been over the past year and half working assiduously to improve facilities for its residents, specially for students. New Dormitories with the added capacity of around 500 residents have been constructed to ease the hostel accommodation in JNU. All the roads leading to and around the hostels and residence area have been repaired and freshly paved to facilitate smooth traffic and parking.

JNU has begun a trial run of E-rickshaws to facilitate residents' movement on this large campus. And, to maintain higher degree of hygiene, JNU has constituted a committee to monitor cleanliness in all its hostels and dormitories and has initiated programmes to keep JNU campus clean and environmentally friendly.

In addition, more than 600 trees were recently planted all over the campus involving NSS and JNU alumni, and most of these have also been adopted by residents of the campus. To keep hostel residences safe, secure and to maintain fair and optimum utilisation of hostel facilities, JNU regularly monitors unauthorised guests in its hostels through routine as well as surprise checks. JNU community, however, is informed to be aware of misinformation spread by a small section of JNU, about such measures as raids and criticizing it for their vested interests. It should be noted that hostel residents cooperate in this process since the inception of the hostel facility in JNU.
